Parents in Partnership is a group of parents and other caregivers who meet together five times during the year to share their family stories, challenges, joys, and triumphs of raising their children; learn about community and statewide resources for children with disabilities; explore issues around health, education, policy making, legislation, inclusion, self-determination, inclusion, family well-being; and IDEA.

The program assists parents in developing further communication, leadership, advocacy and collaboration skills; improve the quality and extent of partnerships between the many professionals they interact with on behalf of their children; work on their own family or community project; increase their knowledge, skills and support to be open to dream and plan ahead for their child and family; become part of a network of parents of children with disabilities who are knowledgeable about education, health and social issues; become active in their communities; support each other and have fun.

Who Can Sign Up?

- Parent(s), foster parent(s), or grandparent(s), who have children with disabilities ages 6-14 are eligible for this program
- Children must be receiving special education services
- Those who have attended a PIP in the past are not eligible to attend
- Space is limited to 25 families
